## A Service of Worship on Good Friday, April 14, 2017 at the Oaklyn Baptist Church

**Introduction:** The following is a brief explanation of the type of service we will conduct on this Good Friday.

It is traditionally called a Tenebrae service. The word "tenebrae" comes from the Latin meaning "darkness." The Tenebrae is an ancient Christian Good Friday service that makes use of gradually diminishing light through the extinguishing of candles to symbolize the events of that week from the triumphant Palm Sunday entry through Jesus' burial. This increasing darkness symbolizes the approaching darkness of Jesus' death and of hopelessness in the world without God. The service concludes in darkness, sometimes with a final candle, the Christ candle, carried out of the sanctuary, symbolizing the death of Jesus. The worshipers then leave in silence to ponder the impact of Christ's death and await the coming Resurrection.

There will be no sermon this evening. The message is in the singing of songs, in the reading of the passion, in the sharing of the Psalms and in the coming of the darkness.... for without the darkness of the cross, the resurrection is not possible.

## A Greeting with Response:

L: And this is the judgment, that the light has come into the world, and we loved darkness rather than light.

## P: God is light, in whom there is no darkness at all.

L: For God sent the Son into the world, not to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him.

# *P*: Every one who does evil hates the light, and does not come to the light. But all who do what is true come to the light.

L: Come, let us worship in spirit and in truth.
