Buffalo Soldier is a nickname given to members of the African American Calvary regiments of the US Army who served in the western United States from 1867 to 1896.

The soldiers helped protect the nation's westward expansion by building roads and participating in significant military actions such as the Red River. Buffalo Soldiers were among the first rangers in what became the National Park Service.


According to popular lore the Native Americans coined the term "Buffalo Soldiers" because their dark curly hair resembled a buffalo mane and the soldiers fought like the fierce Great Plains buffalo. African American soldiers embraced the moniker by World War I, when the 92nd Infantry Division adopted the Buffalo as a symbol for its patch.

African American men have fought in every American war, yet the Buffalo Soldiers, two cavalry and four infantry regiments have a unique place in history and memory. They helped the US become a vast continental nation and ultimately a world power. Facing discrimination in the Army and in towns where they were stationed, Buffalo Soldiers persevered to be a credit to their people and the nation but their sacrifices for the war had not yet made them equal citizens.

The regiments have been immortalized in popular culture though songs, television productions and films.
