Each year, Americans observe National Hispanic Heritage month from September 15-October 15, by celebrating the histories, cultures and contributions of American Citizens whose ancestors came from Spain, Mexico, the Caribbean, Central and South America.

The observation started in 1968 as Hispanic Heritage Week under President Lyndon Johnson and was expanded by President Ronald Reagan in 1988 to cover a 30-day period starting in September 15 and ending October 15. The day of September 15 is significant because it is the anniversary of independence for Latin American countries Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras and Nicaragua. In addition, Mexico and Chile celebrate their Independence Days on September 16 and 18th respectively. Also Columbus Day or Dia de la Raza, which is October 12, falls within this 30 day period.

Traditionally, respect for one's elders and authority figures is an essential aspect of Hispanic culture. Additionally, Hispanic culture places much importance on the concepts of self-respect, dignity, and pride.

Food is typically viewed as a central component in celebrating together as a Hispanic families instill in their children the importance of honor, good manners, and respect for authority and the elderly.
